Animals

- All animals are on the Showground at owner's risk and are not the responsibility of the Show Committee.
- No horses to be stabled in Cattle Tie-up area or led or ridden on top side of Oval.
- All animals shown must have been the property and in possession of the exhibitor or member of household (except where specified) for at least one month prior to the Show.

By-Laws

• The Annual Show is conducted under the Rules and By-Laws of the Kangaroo Valley Agricultural and Horticultural Association Inc. The Committee reserves the right to alter or delete the program as it sees fit.

Accidents and Incidents

- Personal Public Liability Risk is the responsibility of ALL competitors. Where Waivers are required, they MUST be signed by Exhibitors and Competitors as a condition of entry.
- Any accident occurring during the show must be reported to the Secretary or President and verified immediately on the day.
- The Committee will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused by or through any exhibit; and it shall be a condition of entry such exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnify it against any legal proceedings arising from any such accident.
- Any complaints must be made in writing to the Secretary within seven (7) days of the last day of Show.
- Any exhibitors and stall holders intending to bring electrical equipment to the Showground will be required to ensure that such equipment is fitted with earth leakage circuit breakers and that all electrical leads, tools and appliances have been inspected and tagged by a licensed electrical contractor. Any exhibitor or stall holder who does not comply will not be allowed to exhibit at the Showground.
- Competitors agree to participate at their own risk and to indemnify and keep indemnifying the Society against all claims, suit actions or demands which may be brought against it in respect of any injuries or other loss substantiated in the course of competing in any Events.
- The Judges' decision is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.



Conditions

• All competitors must wear a waiver band to indicate that a waiver form has been completed and submitted. Waiver forms and bands are available from the Horse entry tent in the main arena. Competitors under 18 must have a waiver form signed by a parent or guardian.

How to Enter

- All livestock to enter via GATE 1 ENTRIES.
- Post Entries in all events. Entries to be made by purchase of tickets on the day.
- Entry tent location in centre ring on Friday and Saturday a.m.
- Prizes may be awarded in all classes at the Judge's discretion. 1st, 2nd and 3rd ribbons will be awarded in all classes where entries are sufficient.
- See individual classes for Entry fees

Prizes

- Prize money will be awarded as stated in each class.
- E.A. Cards or Numbers MUST be produced on day or within one month to enable prize money to be paid.

EA SAFE PRACTICE GUIDELINES

- 1. Stallions should wear official "discs" at all times whilst at the venue. These discs are to be worn on both sides of head collars and bridles or on same part of the horse on both sides to identify to others that the horse is a stallion.
- 2. No stallion is to be moved around a venue without displaying the stallion discs and a suitable restraint.
- 3. Where possible all stallions are to be stabled. If suitable stabling is not available stallions need to wear a collar, which is securely tied to the outside of a truck or trailer. Stallions tied to the outside of a truck or trailer MUST be supervised at all times.
- 4. ABCRA Guidelines for Stallions All stallions must be double tied by neck strap and halter on all grounds. Junior members are allowed to ride stallions in single horse events only and when not competing the stallion to be under adult supervision at all times.
- 5. Drug testing may be carried out at this Show.
- 6. Any competitor found to have breached the ASC disputes and disciplinary regulations will be investigated by the ASC Disciplinary Committee.
- 7. All riders in Sporting and Show jumping events MUST wear an AS/NZS3838 A.S.A. Helmet. All helmets will be inspected for correct tagging.
- 8. Show jumping: To compete in all official Show jumping classes, horses must be registered with the E.A.
- 9. Sporting Regulations will be the same as those of the Bushmen's Carnival.
- 10. The Show reserves the right to test show exhibitors for prohibited substances.
- 11. For all Breed Classes Appropriate registration papers to be produced at the request of the Steward.
- 12. Stallions shall not compete in Hack or Rider classes.

- 13. Measuring: Current E.A. Measuring Card to be produced on demand. If exhibit has no card, the exhibit will be required to be measured on demand.
- 14. Definition of Novice/Maiden: A NOVICE is a horse which has not been placed 1st in any individual ridden class of the same class at any Official Show. A MAIDEN is a horse which has not been placed in any individual ridden class of the same event at any Official Show.
- 15. Riders in age classes may be required to produce proof of age.
- 16. Junior rider 16 yrs. & under. Adult Rider 17 yrs. & over.
- 17. All riders MUST sign a Waiver Form.
- 18. Each horse may only compete in 3 separate showjumping classes for the day.



SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- 1. Points will be awarded on the basis of 1st place, 10 points; 2nd place, 8 points; 3rd place, 6 points, 4th place, 4 points and 5th place, 2 points.
- 2. Points will be awarded in all show jumping classes conducted by participating shows except for classes for juniors and novelty events.
- 3. Horses are eligible for points from one class only on each day. In the event that a horse places in more than one class, the highest points earned that day will be added to its score.
- 4. Only horses registered with the E.A. are eligible to compete.
- 5. Each event will be conducted until a first placing is reached.
- 6. Points for minor placing will be equally divided by the minor place winners.
- 7. Horses which are ungraded during the competition retain the points earned.
- 8. Points awarded by each society must be supplied immediately after the show to the Group 5 secretary: Sue Sharpe, group05@tpg.com.au
- 9. Any dispute concerning the competition must be referred to the Group 5 secretary in writing for reference to the committee.
- 10. The competition will conclude on the date of the last scheduled participating show in Group 5.
- 11. Competitors may compete in 3 classes only per horse.
- 12. Results to be sent to the Secretary, Sue Sharpe.

Hints on Exhibition Cooking

- It is important you read the schedule carefully and check closing times for entries.
- Read your recipe it could mean the difference between success or failure.
- Always weigh your ingredients.
- Never turn your cake onto a cake cooler. The marks are regarded as a decoration. Place on a board covered with tea towels.
- Do not use package cake unless stated.
- Use castor sugar for finer cakes.
- Nuts must be chopped.
- Most important to use fresh ingredients, especially shortening.
- Do not use cornflour in sponge unless stated on schedule.
- Do not use ring tin unless stated on schedule.
- Do not put your cakes in plastic containers or bags before judging as this can draw moisture use cellophane for best results.
- Biscuits and pikelets should be dainty.
- Lamingtons should be butter mixture, approximately 4cm.
- Ice cake on top only unless otherwise stated in schedule no decorations.
- Use icing not frosting.
- Weigh sponge mixture for even heights.
- Do not over-flavour, especially soda.
- Do not trim cake.
- Flour to be brushed off scones and bread.
- Remove baking paper before presentation.
- Thick cardboard covered with foil is good to display your cakes on, alternatively boards or plain white plates can be used, paper and disposables are also OK.

- The winner at Kangaroo Valley Show goes on to the Group 5 Final. Judging will take place at the Group 5 zone meeting at 10am on 4th November 2023 at Albion Park and 2nd November 2024. Exhibitors are able to bring their cakes and wait to take them home, or delegates can bring the cake.
- MUST BE AN UNCUT CAKE
- The following recipe is compulsory for all entrants.

RICH FRUIT CAKE

Here's what you need:

- 250g (8oz) sultanas
- 250g (8oz) chopped raisins
- 250g (8oz) currants
- 125g (4oz) chopped mixed peel
- 90g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries
- 90g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds
- 1/3 cup sherry or brandy
- 250g (8oz) plain flour
- 60g (2oz) self-raising flour
- 1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
- 250g (8oz) butter
- 250g (8oz) soft brown sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind
- 1/2 teaspoon almond essence
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 4 large eggs

Here's what you do:

- Mix together the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy.
- Cover and leave for at least one 1 hour, but preferably overnight.
- Sift together the flours and spices.
- Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences.

- Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, and then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures.
- Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon.
- Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8 x 8 inches) tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3½-4 hours.
- Allow the cake to cool in the tin.
- To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4 to 6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3 to 4 pieces.
- The height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (57mm).

- 4. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If not available, such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
- 5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organisation.
- 6. All three articles/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- 7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- 8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level, one Group at State level.
- 9. Exhibit (article/garment) previously exhibited at Group level is not eligible to compete again.



- All competitors must complete and sign a waiver form and wear a waiver band to indicate that a waiver form has been submitted. Waiver forms and bands are available from the Waiver Station. Competitors under 18 must have a waiver form signed by a parent or guardian.
- The competition is open to all dogs. (Dogs in season are not permitted on the showground.)
- Each competitor must agree and understand that their dog/dogs, and they, have entered the competition/s at their own risk and that the conveners and/or their representatives accept no responsibility for any risk or injury, however caused.
- All dogs not jumping must be on a lead with a handler in the marshalling area away from the jump run area.
- Only one dog may be loose in the competition area at any one time.
- Any mishandling or misuse of any dog will incur immediate disqualification.
- The safety and well-being of dogs and participants is paramount, and the Stewards decision in these matters is final. Stewards may also direct handlers with aggressive or uncontrolled dogs to leave the competition/grounds with their dogs.
- The competition is a test of the dog's jumping ability. The dog is to jump over the plank wall; however, the dog can touch any part of the jump in order to get over the wall.
- Each dog is allowed three attempts to jump each height in order to progress to the next height. Dogs shall be disqualified if unsuccessful after the 3rd attempt.
- The handler has the right to select the height, above the minimum, at which the dog will commence competition. Once in the competition, dogs must jump all the following heights.
- The dogs can be encouraged over the jump by a handler, vocally, visually and with toys.
- The dogs can remain on the lead during the run up and jumping, however the dogs cannot be assisted by pushing or pulling the lead or the dog.
- It is suggested that two handlers are required, with one handler releasing the dog at the jump run up and the other handler to manage the dog once over the jump. Only one handler is allowed on the platform behind the jump at any time.
- If more than one dog reaches the final height, a count back on refusals will be done and the dog with the least refusals will be the winner. If all are equal the prize will be shared.






